### Hereford City – Winter Night Shelter

Please pray for the success of the night shelter in keeping homeless people safe this winter in Hereford and by supporting them towards appropriate longer term accommodation, with the hope of a healthy, purposeful and fulfilling lifestyle. The Night Shelter will be on Whitecross Road in Hereford and is managed by Herefordshire Council.

What can you do to help? Because of lack of facilities at the Shelter, the wardens are unable to provide food but will be providing food vouchers to purchase meals in local commercial outlets. 'Hereford Open Door', the well-established independent charity will be coordinating and managing the cost of evening drinks and snacks plus the food vouchers at estimated cost of up to £15 000.
